NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

Authors are requested to note the following: All research papers should be submitted either to the General Secretary, WBPSA or to the Editor, West Bengal Political Science Review on CD, using MS Word format (1.5 spaced, font size 11, font - Times New Roman). It can also be sent as an attachment to the editor – editor's email address is: wbpsreditor@gmail.com with a note that his/her article has neither been published nor been communicated to any other journal for publication. The author should clearly state his/her name, designation, affiliation, mailing address and e-mail.

The reference style should be as follows:

All references to books, articles etc. should be cited inside the text. The direct citation will follow this pattern (Author, Year: Page). For example: **“Governments also fail in their human rights obligations through simple neglect or even complete lack of interest in the human rights of certain groups in their society” (Stacy: 2009: 7).**

In case of referring to works without directly quoting from book/article etc, it should be: **In her book Helen M. Stacy (2009) responds to the ‘civil society’ critique of human rights laws and legal institutions.**

Details of references should be given at the end of the article and be arranged in alphabetical order.
